C- Vs K- Spelling Rules

## C- / K- at the beginning of the word

When you hear the /k/ sound at the beginning of a word it is either a <C> or <k>

Use a <C> when the next letter is an <a, o, u>

Use a <k> when the next letter is an <e, i>

Note: Always use a <C> for the /k/ sound at the beginning of a word where the next letter is a Consonant.
